GIVE ME ONE GOOD REASON

Annual Meeting of the Strawbridge Shrine Association asks "Why should you care?"

Robert Strawbridge never wrote down one of his sermons. He didn't leave us any papers to pour over and debate. He didn't leave behind his words for us to ponder, question or even find inspiration in. Why is it that someone who is famous for his preaching left no sermons to be passed down through time?

Because Strawbridge was not concerned with history. He was a frontier preacher on the cutting edge of a new movement. He never looked back. Whether it was in making the bold choice to leave home and come to the new world, or simply in always speaking the message that spoke to the moment. Yesterday's sermons didn't matter. He wanted his congregations to focus on today. And on tomorrow.

So it would be ironic if the Strawbridge Shrine were only a museum. We might guess that Robert would hate to be looked upon as a statue; unmoving... unchanging... historic. It is important to the <u>Strawbridge Shrine Association</u> that our mission is not merely a ministry of remembrance... but of witness.

Dolores Martin is the Conference Lay Leader for the Baltimore-Washington Conference. Like Strawbridge, she has spent years lifting and supporting other lay people in finding their own voice and in becoming a part of God's work in their local area. Dolores' work has taken her to every corner of the Conference and put her in the spotlight at Annual Conferences. We look forward to hearing her message in one of the places where the denomination was born.

John Strawbridge is the Communications Coordinator for the Shrine Association, the Vice President of the Baltimore-Washington Conference United Methodist Historical Society, and on the Conference Board of Trustees. As a descendent of Robert's he not only carries some of his DNA, but even serves the same congregation as Lay Leader at Lovely Lane UMC, where Robert and Asbury were appointed as the first pastors.

Rev. Dr. Douglas Tzan is the senior pastor at the Sykesville Parish (St. Paul's and Gaither United Methodist Churches) and Director of the Doctor of Ministry & Course of Study Programs and Assistant Professor of Church History & Mission at Wesley Theological Seminary. As both professor and pastor, Doug has one foot in the world of history and one foot in active ministry. He brings both knowledge and experience to our discussion.

As we continue to alternate among the churches with historic connection to Robert, our venue returns to the Bethel Church (New Hope UMC, 3001 Hooper Rd., New Windsor, MD 21776). This congregation is a successor to the society that met in the Log Meeting House – America's first Methodist House of Worship. We will gather at 9:45 AM and have a time of Worship. The meeting itself includes election of the incoming class of the Board of Directors and other important business as required by our By-Laws.

Following the presentation by our speakers, we will move to the church social hall to enjoy a freshly prepared lunch and fellowship. Reservations are required for the lunch so that we may allow Bethel to prepare, and the contribution of \$15.00 covers the cost of the food.

Mark your calendar now and plan to be with us on **October 27** as we discover the lessons that Robert still is teaching us today. A reservation form with information and directions is included with this news bulletin.
